The two names most often associated with masterful Japanese woodcut prints are Hiroshige and Hokusai. Ando Hiroshige was **renowned** for his landscapes, such as *Rain Shower on Ohashi Bridge*. As in many of Hiroshige's prints, the work is composed primarily of diagonals-the bridge slanting from lower left to middle right, the rain slashing down at a different angle, the riverbank cutting across at yet another diagonal. The figures crossing the bridge are small and are depicted not as individuals but as people responding to, and buffeted by, the weather. In a Hiroshige landscape nature is grand and people are small. The long parallel lines of the rain give this print a wonderful rich visual texture.

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Katsushika Hokusai also made many landscapes during his **prolific** career. Best known are his numerous views of Mount Fuji-the cone-shaped volcano that is the highest mountain in Japan and is considered a sacred spot to the Japanese. Hokusai drew Fuji in all seasons, in all weathers, and from many vantage points. *View of Fuji From Seven-Ri Beach* presents a vista that seems not entirely of this world. The white cone of the mountain hovers tranquilly in a realm of puffy green foliage and vivid blue clouds.
